HOW TO: Using a Token Board for Mask Wearing



Establish Parameters

- 1. Identify how often your child will earn a token (For example: the child will get a token for every minute he/she correctly wears a mask during remote instruction.)
- 2. Verbally and <u>visually</u> communicate how the child will earn each token. (For example, place a picture of mask wearing on the token board)
- 3. Select highly preferred items/activities (rewards) that the child will receive IMMEDIATELY after he/she earns 5 tokens (For example, a hug, tickles, an M&M, play with a doll, etc.)

Prior to beginning Remote Instruction or other activity,

- 1. Have your child choose which highly preferred item/activity that he/she is working for
- 2. Have a visual reminder of the item/activity that your child is working for (For example, have the item close where the child can see it but cannot access it or use a picture to represent the item/activity)
- 3. Place the token board in a visually available location throughout the activity

When your child has earned a token,

- 1. Verbally praise your child while handing him/her a token
- 2. Provide hand over hand assistance to put the token on the board if needed

If your child is unsuccessful (i.e. removes mask, pulls it down under his/her nose),

- 1. Stop your one minute timer
- 2. Remind your child what he/she is working for by pointing to the visual representation of the reward and stating "What are we working for? Mask on."
- 3. Provide physical assistance if needed
- 4. Avoid providing multiple verbal prompts
- 5. Once the mask is repositioned, restart timer (or reset the timer if appropriate)

Helpful Strategies

- 1. Read mask wearing social story prior to placing this demand
- 2. Use Modeling (wear a mask yourself) while this expectation is on your child
- 3. Place a picture of the child's favorite character/animal/etc. wearing a mask near your child. A verbal prompt could be "Let's wear the mask like "Mickey!"
- 4. Use a timer to identify each time your child is successful with mask wearing
- 5. Do not provide any of the preferred items/activities your child identified if not earned
